The sisters just can't meet the huge prices of conforming with ever stricter health and safety measures. Please do pray for all the residents, and in particular our Priest-residents, Monsignor Gabriel Leydon, Bermingham, Canon Frank Canon O'Driscoll, Fr. Pat De Wolf and Fr. John Alan Bell. Many of us would have grown up with the sight of the Sisters in our cities and towns holding their boxes out for donations. These great sisters live their religious life prayerfully and generously: Their departure from the city of Bristol and the Clifton diocese is incalculable loss.

CLERGY MOVES

At this time of the year the bishop usually looks at clergy moves that will take place over the summer. This is becoming more and more of a challenge as our priests are getting older and fewer. In our area Fr. Matt Anscombe will be leaving Saint Bernadette's Whitchurch in June. Fr Matt is joining the Society of Saint James and will be going to work in Peru. We wish him well and thank him for his ministry in Clifton Diocese. There is no decision on his replacement yet, but it is a huge ministry to cover: The parishes of Saint Bernadette Whitchurch, Saint Pius Hartcliffe, Sacred Heart Chew Magna, Saint Dunstan's Keynsham and for the present Christ the King in Knowle West.

Monsignor Bernard Massey retires over the summer from Saint Bonaventure's in Bishopston, and Canon Tom Finnegan will serve there along with Sacred Heart Westbury and Saint Anthony's Henbury. Pray for our Bishop as he has some tough decisions to make.
