#### THE WORD THIS WEEK

Advent opens with a great promise: 'In the days to come' – the hope of a people who need God. '... The master is coming' is also a promise, not a threat to breed fear, but to answer our cry. So, Advent begins, not with thoughts of the past, with the coming of the Lord we celebrate at Christmas, but with the future, and the promise that He is coming back. We are encouraged to stay awake, and treat every day as the day the Lord will come; we do not do this out of fear for a Master who beats his servants, but out of love of a Master who always treats us with mercy. Nevertheless, we must always be watchful, because we can grow sleepy and complacent, saying that we can leave this prayer or that confession or the other change in the way we live to tomorrow. Even as we look forward to the tomorrow of the Lord's coming, we must remember that it might be today!

#### BLESSING OF BAMBINELLI - I Ith DEC

This is a beautiful Advent Tradition - Bambinelli Sunday, Blessing the Christ Child - which has been celebrated in Rome for over thirty years and helps children and young people to prepare for Jesus. Each family will bring the Christ Child from its own crib or Nativity scene and the Pope blesses it during the noon Angelus that day. It is a wonderful way to bring family and parish together. Following that tradition, I encourage families to bring the baby Jesus from their own cribs to church on the Third Sunday of Advent and, at the end of Mass, I will bless the Bambinelli which have been brought to church. ## ADVENT LECTIO DIVINA AND CHRISTIAN MEDITATION

For Advent, we pray the scriptures with Lectio Divina. We will use a Sunday reading of each week of Advent. You may be familiar with this or curious to know more.

The reading is read three times by different members of the group. Following the first reading we absorb the words and digest them into ourselves.

We hold a couple of minutes of silence then hear the reading again. After the second reading, group members are invited to say the words or phrases that have spoken to them/caught their attention. It doesn't matter if others have said these words before, as we go with the flow and see what God is saying to each of us through the scripture words. We have more silence. Then the words are read again and this is followed by how the words have affected anyone in the group.
