THE WORD THIS WEEK

While the world may seem to be very indifferent to Christianity most of the time, it can be very critical of Christians who do not seem to be following the most basic tenet of their faith – to be a people of 'good deeds', as Jesus teaches in today's portion of the Sermon on the Mount. While we may sometimes feel indignant about the world's criticism of our faults, we have to remember that we are in a vital relationship with 'the word' – we are to be its light. This means that we should welcome the world's gaze and scrutiny of our actions and beliefs and we should, in a sense, be accountable to the world for the way we live. We should never be salt that loses its taste. This openness to the gaze of all is not for our own glory, however: it is so that others may find what we have found – their way to the Father.

PRAYER OF DEDICATION OF A CHURCH

When a new church is dedicated, the bishop leads a ceremony rich in symbolism. Water, word, incense, chrism, and candles are just a few of the signs used to signify the holiness of this house of prayer. There will be music and processions, decorations and preaching. But the most important moment in this special rite is the Prayer of Dedication. In the Prayer of Dedication the bishop prays that God will make this church an ever-holy place. The prayer has much to say, and it asks much of God. As in all liturgical prayer, it begins by calling upon God by some title—in this case, “O God, sanctifier and ruler of your Church”. Then the prayer speaks about the mystery of the Church. The Church has many attributes: It is fruitful, holy, favoured, and exalted by God. It brings forth new members, reaches out to the world, becomes the dwelling place of God, and stands as a city on a hill. Once all this has been recalled, the bishop asks God to send the Holy Spirit “to make this for ever a holy place / with a table always prepared for the / Sacrifice of Christ”. That is the central sentiment of the entire prayer. The text continues, praying that in this place Baptism may overwhelm sin, God’s children may be fed at the tables of the Word and the Eucharist, and prayer may resound for the world’s salvation. The text also prays that in this building the poor will find justice, that victims of oppression will find true freedom, and that the whole world will enter God’s city of peace by setting foot in this church.
